





We also have bespoke facilities and equipment for hair and make-up, and production design at Brighton Film Studios, a dedicated filmmaking facility that is one of the only film lots of its kind on the South Coast. The huge 21,000 square foot space houses state-of-the-art facilities for our students, applicants and industry partners.

As well as this at Screen and Film School Brighton, we pride ourselves on being one of the few education providers to offer the opportunity to use both digital and analogue cameras. Ranging from Super 16mm to 35mm (the Arriflex SR3 (Super 16mm) and the Panavision Panaflex Gold II (35mm), students will have the option to choose which film format will best serve their film. All our film stock is processed at Pinewood Studios by Kodak – the same processors who have worked on world famous features.

These shows and projects are also a great opportunity for graduating students to invite agencies and industry connections to watch them in action, which boosts their chances of securing representation or job contracts there and then. These productions are of a very high standard and serve as a wonderful opportunity for every one of our talented performing arts students.

Graduate success

Birmingham

At the heart of this activity is Digbeth, where you will find BIMM Music Institute, Screen and Film School and Performers College. Digbeth is a highly creative district located to the south of the city centre and is known for being a hub for artistic people. The juxtaposition of old industrial buildings with contemporary creative endeavors gives Digbeth its distinctive charm.

In recent years, the city has undergone a transformation, shedding its gritty industrial image to become a thriving hub for creative industries. Birmingham's architecture, blending classic and contemporary elements, has attracted Hollywood productions, including Steven Spielberg's Ready Player One. Films such as Kingsman: The Golden Circle and the unmissable television series Peaky Blinders were also filmed in the city.

Birmingham boasts a range of cinemas, from IMAX and 3D theatres to independent gems like The Electric Cinema and MAC Birmingham.

Student life in Birmingham offers everything you will ever need, with its green spaces, bustling creative district, thriving nightlife, and expanding film and television industry. Moreover, Birmingham's diverse architecture provides an ideal backdrop for creative people of all persuasions.

Did you know?

Peaky Blinders creator Steven Knight is currently building 'Loc Studios' in Digbeth. Situated on Fazeley Street, this huge new development already has a roster of productions that will take place there in the near future. Whispers are that the *Peaky* feature film will be shot here. Crucially for BIMM University students, the project is predicted to create at least 700 new jobs in the area.





















Brighton

In Brighton, you can study at: BIMM Music Institute, Institute for Contemporary Theatre and Screen and Film School.

Brighton is home to some of the best independent record labels, cinemas, shops, and arts venues anywhere in the UK.

From a music perspective, huge artists such as Rag'n'Bone Man, Royal Blood, Bonobo, and James Bay all launched in and around Brighton. The city also boasts unique recording studios (Brighton Electric, Small Pond, Metway), labels (Fatcat, Mr Bongo, Tru Thought Recordings), and record shops (Bella Union Vinyl, Resident). Furthermore, venues that deserve a shout out include Concorde 2, The Hope & Ruin, The Dome, and Brighton Centre. As well as this, The Great Escape Festival, Europe's leading showcase for new music, takes place here annually.

Brighton Festival is the largest arts festival in England and is a major milestone in the city's cultural calendar. It has a long tradition of attracting the most exciting performers from across the globe, as well as promoting local artists and bringing fresh new work to Brighton.

Shifting focus to video games, Brighton has been a hub for this exciting industry for over 30 years. The city boasts a huge population of developers, with over 90 games companies making their homes here. These include Studio Gobo, who worked on Hogwarts Legacy and Electric Square, who worked on Diablo 4 and Lords of the Fallen. As well as that impressive roster, game engine giant Unity has its European HQ in the city.

Brighton's artistic vibrancy extends to film. It has attracted filmmakers for decades, offering diverse filming locations for movies like *Brighton Rock*, *Quadrophenia*, 20,000 Days on Earth and most recently *My Policeman* and ITV's *Grace*.

The city hosts key industry events like CINECITY, and Brighton Rocks International Film Festival, attracting filmmakers from around the world on an annual basis. The Duke of York's Picturehouse, one of the UK's longest-running cinemas, adds to Brighton's cinematic legacy. The city and its surroundings offer visually stunning environments, from bustling streets to iconic seascapes and picturesque countryside across the South Downs National Park.

Brighton's seaside location, recently voted the happiest place to live and work in the UK, offers a cosmopolitan city lifestyle along with an award-winning beach and outdoor cinema during the long hot summer months. With its reputation as a talent hub and home to production companies like Warner Brothers International, Brighton is an ideal place to start a career in the creative industries. It offers a unique blend of creativity, talent, and opportunities for those passionate about music, film, video games and the performing arts.

Did you know?

The city has a long history of embracing diversity, tolerance, and non-conformity. It became a prominent center for the LGBTQ+ community and played a significant role in the development of the UK's gay rights movement. Brighton hosts the largest Pride festival in the country, attracting thousands of visitors from around the world each year.

















Bristol

Bristol is a city where music and art collide. This creative community is renowned for its drum & bass, trip hop, and punk scenes, and Bristol's musical landscape encompasses everything from folk to techno and performance art. Notable acts such as Roni Size, Massive Attack, Portishead, and IDLES have catapulted an already vibrant city into the spotlight, a city that also boasts live music venues such as The Exchange, Strange Brew, and Thekla. Whereas annual festivals such as Love Saves The Day and St. Pauls Carnival continue showcase the city's rich musical heritage.

Bristol is also conveniently located just an hour away from Glastonbury, one of the most celebrated musical festivals the world over and living in the Southwest provides opportunities to engage in other unmissable festivals such as Boardmasters, and Green Man. BIMM Music Institute Bristol's close ties with these festivals and its experienced lecturers, who are involved in key roles and have launched their own successful events like 2000trees and ArcTangent, offer students hands-on learning experiences and valuable industry connections.

BIMM Music Institute Bristol itself was established in 2008, and our campus has two buildings in the heart of the city's artistic hub, Stokes Croft. The most impressive aspect of this campus is St James' House on Moon Street, a four-storey, 33,000 square feet former office building. A 2022 upgrade in facilities and equipment supported learning across all of our single and joint honours courses. As well as several Mac labs, study spaces, edit suites, rehearsal rooms and lecture rooms, the new building also houses two industry-standard recording studios and live rooms, a creative media suite with a green screen and professional lighting rig, two high specification performance spaces, a glass DJ performance booth,






Student wellbeing





Remote auditions and interviews


We appreciate that it may not be possible for you to visit us in person ahead of starting your course, which is why we offer remote auditions and interviews (via video or phone).

Entry criteria

English language requirements

If your first language is not English, you may need to submit proof of your English language proficiency. Should this be required, we accept a wide range of country specific qualifications and a number of approved English language tests. Fees vary depending on whether you are a UK or international student, and whether you intend to study full-time or part-time, but our friendly finance and admissions teams are always on hand to guide you through the process. Financial support | The Fair Access Fund
