I also had a memorable workshop with Christina Grade, who emphasised the importance of standing out during auditions. Her advice stuck with me, encouraging me to find that unique quality that captivates an audience.

In terms of dream roles, being part of *Mamma Mia!* has been a lifelong dream, whether it's in the ensemble or as a dance captain. I also dream of working for Disney as a princess and performing in iconic musicals like *Dirty Dancing*, *Grease* and *Hairspray*. Beyond musicals, I'm drawn to commercial work and enjoy the thrill of being a backing dancer for artists or gracing stages like the Brit Awards. Ultimately, I aspire to become an agent and support others in their artistic journeys.

Ambition is key in this industry. It's essential to believe in yourself and your unique journey while supporting others in theirs. Each path is different and maintaining that drive through challenges is crucial. Stay focused on your goals and never underestimate your worth.





Birmingham's city centre is rich with museums and galleries, and in December, the German Christmas market offers unique gifts, delicious food and a wonderful festive atmosphere.

Our top tip: take a trip to nearby Stratford-upon-Avon to see the Royal Shakespeare Company in action. This historic town is the birthplace of William Shakespeare and offers a unique glimpse into the world of classical theatre.





Facilities

Our Birmingham facilities consist of six dance studios, two acting studios, vocal study rooms, cutting-edge Mac Labs and a physiotherapy treatment room. All studios are equipped with Harlequin sprung flooring, ballet barres, wall mirrors, keyboards, digital equipment and high quality sound systems.

You'll share the main building with film students at MetFilm School. This partnership allows for exciting collaborations, as well as access to state-of-the-art film studio facilities.



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One of the best things about Performers College Birmingham is its fantastic facilities. It has six large dance studios you can book, as well as acting and singing rehearsal spaces. 

Brighton


Brighton is a true epicentre for the arts. The city's liberal and forward-thinking ethos is reflected in its art, which is all about selfexpression and activism.

Take part in huge festivals: Brighton Festival and Brighton Fringe both take place in May each year, and in August you'll experience the joy of Brighton Pride. Film enthusiasts will also love CINECITY and Brighton Rocks International Film Festival.

Admire the stunning scenery: Brighton's iconic pebble beach is just a short walk from the Lanes and the city centre, and you can also take the bus into the South Downs to explore the beautiful English countryside.

Our top tip: wander around the Lanes for boutique clothes stores, charity shops and independent cafés. Moreover, with a whole host of innovative vegetarian and vegan restaurants around the city, you'll be spoiled for choice when it comes to dining out.



Facilities

Our main Brighton campus, The Circle, is on the seafront in Portslade, a short bus ride from the city centre. Here, you'll find 11 large studios with high ceilings, all equipped with keyboards, digital equipment and strong sound systems. Two of these studios have full lighting rigs and four have sprung flooring, ballet barres and wall mirrors.

There is also an impressive in-house theatre, where we host our countless student productions. This substantial complex boasts changing areas, a spacious reception with an amphitheatre, and plenty of self-study pods.

Our Brighton campus is also one of the few university sites in the UK to have its own motion capture suite.

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The facilities are topnotch, especially the dance studios. I often find myself practising in these spaces before and after classes, and I'm grateful for the freedom to use them.

Facilities

At our Essex campus, our bespoke performing arts centre in Corringham boasts 25 dance, acting and singing studios, all of which feature Harlequin sprung flooring, ballet barres, wall mirrors, keyboards, digital equipment and impeccable sound systems. Students will also have access to a library, a computer suite, a fully equipped gymnasium and a physiotherapy department.

The second site, which caters to our MA and Acting students, is situated in Rayleigh. Here, you'll find three dance studios, an acting suite and a theatre studio space. The acting suite is modern and sophisticated, boasting a range of specialist cameras, sets and green screens.



On-site wellbeing and learning support

Whichever campus you choose to complete your studies, you'll have access to an onsite team of wellbeing and learning support advisors, who work hard to make sure you have access to the support you need. Through oneto-one sessions with tutors or drop-ins with our wellbeing advisors, we provide a safe and confidential space for you to explore your own personal development.

Supporting your journey

From when you first join us to the time you graduate, we'll work on helping you build the confidence and resilience to deal with life's challenges. Learning support

Our dedicated Learning Support Teams can work with you to ensure you are able to engage fully with your learning and achieve academic success. The support available includes:

Start your application

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If you're a domestic student applying to one of our undergraduate courses, please apply to Performers College through UCAS. If you're an international student and only wish to apply to Performers College for undergraduate study, or you are a UK/International student applying for the Trinity Diploma or a master's course, please apply directly to Performers College by creating an applicant account and submitting an online application form.



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Book your audition 2

When your application has been reviewed, our Admissions Team will send you an email with details on how to book your place for an in-person Audition Day. Once a booking has been made, you will receive a confirmation email with the date, time and location, as well as information on what to prepare. If you are unable to attend in person, you can submit a self-tape. Please let us know if this is preferred and we will send you our self-tape guidelines.

Attend your audition m STEP

Audition Days are held on campus and are conducted by our Senior Management Team and lecturers. This is your time to show us what you can do, and you'll receive valuable feedback on how to further enhance your skills. For details on the audition format for your chosen course, please visit our website.

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View your offer

If we are able to offer you a place, our Admissions Team will send you an offer pack. For those who applied via UCAS, details of the offer can be viewed on your UCAS Hub, whereas for direct applications, you'll find these details on your account in the BIMM University applicant portal. If you have a conditional offer, please review the conditions that need to be met. Once these conditions have been fulfilled, your offer will be changed to unconditional.



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Accept your offer

If you applied via UCAS, you must accept your offer via your UCAS hub. You can only do this once you have received decisions from all your choices. If you applied directly, please sign in to your applicant portal and follow the instructions to confirm your place. Please check if a deposit is required - you'll find details of how to pay in your offer pack. If you require assistance at any point in the process, please contact our Admissions Team, who will be happy to answer your questions.

At Performers College, we're very proud to welcome students from all over the world. If you're currently in your final year at school or college, you can begin your application with us prior to completing your current qualification.

International applicants

All international students must apply directly to Performers College by creating an applicant account and submitting our online application form. For further guidance, contact our International Admissions Team at international@bimm.ac.uk.
